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OBJECTIVE & ENRICHMENTS

The given academic planner is a school docket designed to help students stay organized, track projects, and exams, follow class schedules, meet deadlines, take notes & more. It increases the student's accountability to the commitment planned as well as provides them with a structure that contributes to their success.

Notebooks Assessment: Handwriting and Notebooks maintenance reflects one's working habits and personality. Therefore, Subject wise notebooks assessment is carried out by subject teachers in each term and weightage is added to the terminal result. The various parameters for the evaluation include handwriting, index, work completion, work submission, follow up of remarks given and maintenance of notebooks.

Inspections: In order to inculcate good working habits among the students regular inspections are carried out by the school which include uniforms, bags, notebooks.

P.D (Personality Development)- To enhance Linguistic skills among the students, assessment of speaking and listening skills is carried out by the subject teachers in each term in the form of quiz, extempore, debates, discussions, storytelling and presentation.

Scholarship test: The school conducts scholarship test in the month of January in order to develop competitive spirit among the students. Scholarship is given to the selected students month wise.

NTSE, Olympiads: For Better academic exposure, students are given the opportunity to showcase their talent through various competitive exams like STSE, NTSE and Olympiads.

Student Council & Investiture Ceremony: The Student Council helps share ideas, interests & concern with teachers & school principal. Realizing better sense of duty and honour and to develop leadership qualities. Students are encouraged to be the part of it and allocated with the duties in investiture ceremony. Students are selected for junior and senior cabinet depending upon their caliber and other qualities to take care of the discipline and other academic possibilities .

Rank and Honour: Academic ability is recognized in the form of a 'Scholar Badge' which is given to top 10 academic performers of every class. Students who come under top 10 positions for 3 consecutive years receive a '**Blue Blazer**' and those who hold the same position (within top 10) for 6 consecutive years receive a '**Blue Tie**'. If they graduate within 10 positions overall, they are awarded a '**Gold Medal**' by the School

Activity Oriented Curriculum:

- 1. Scholastic and Co- Scholastic Activities:** To supplement the academic curriculum and help in learning by doing school conducts co-curricular activities along with scholastic on regular basis in order to develop problem solving , reasoning and other collaborative abilities.
- 2. Inter-School Activities:** To teach team work and to enhance social and emotional learning, THPMS gives opportunity to the students to participate in various inter –school activities. Through these activities students get a platform to showcase their hidden strength and skills.

English Language Acquisition (ELA): In order to improve the communication skills of the students the language teachers plan and execute variety of reading , listening and speaking activities through ELA slots.

Spatial Perception Skills (SPS): Spatial Skills are high order skills such as problem solving, creative thinking & reasoning which support the students to perform well academically and in day-to-day life as well.

Evaluation System is devised to develop the habit of regular and systematic working amongst the students. Objective Type/Applications based/short answer questions get due weightage in the question papers to make the test more reliable and comprehensive.

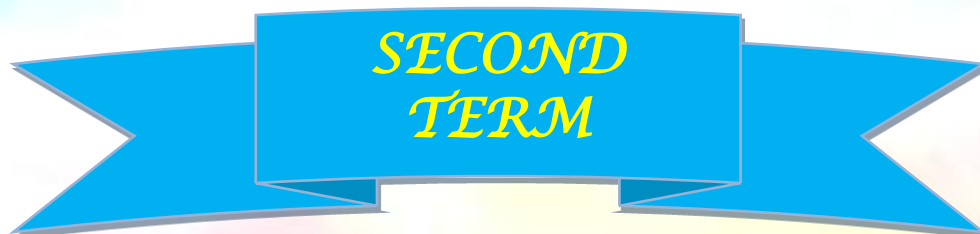
